Cornea Specialist

The Department of Ophthalmology at Weill Cornell Medical College/New York-Presbyterian Hospital is searching for a board-certified or board-eligible cornea specialist at the Assistant/Associate Professor level. Individuals must be eligible for licensure in New York and possess demonstrated expertise in the management of corneal disorders and surgery as well as the management of ocular surface diseases. Candidates with an additional interest in advanced cataract surgery and related general ophthalmology are particularly encouraged to apply. While the primary focus of this position is cornea practice within the academic and teaching environment of the Cornea Service, there is substantial flexibility to develop a practice that would also include some degree of general ophthalmology in accord with a particular applicant's interests and goals.

The Department has three locations with cornea services offered in all locations. The main facility is housed in an elegant, state-of-the-art 22,000 sq. ft. facility within the Weill Greenberg Center for Ambulatory Care, and the program includes ACGME-accredited residency programs in ophthalmology, with a diverse patient population. In addition, the Department has opened a newly-constructed suite of offices in association with NY Presbyterian/Lower Manhattan Hospital expansion. A third suite of offices has just been opened on 69th Street near the main facility. The Ophthalmology Department's Dyson Research Laboratory contains an additional 11,000 sq. ft. of bench laboratory space, and the adjacent facilities of New York-Presbyterian and affiliated institutions provide an unmatched opportunity for patient access, research collaborations, facilities, and training.

This position offers the possibility of developing an important and fulfilling academic career in cornea with the collaboration of a talented and cohesive academic faculty in an outstanding medical complex within the vibrant city of New York.
