

The University of California, Davis, School of Medicine, Department of Internal Medicine, Division of Nephrology is recruiting for a fulltime academic position of Assistant Researcher in the Professional Research series. The successful candidate is required to engage in research and University and public service and will work collaboratively with a diverse group of faculty researchers in the Division/Department.

Candidate must possess a Ph.D. and/or M.D. degree and post-doctoral experience. The successful candidate will be a basic scientist with a record of achievement in bench research related to basic renal physiology, renal cancer, and/or hereditary renal disease. Candidate must have interest in and the ability to teach undergraduate and graduate students, in addition to mentoring post-doctoral fellows.

This position requires creative contributions to and collaborative development of an active research program investigating topics relevant to the research area of kidney metabolic reprogramming including cancer and hereditary kidney disease. The candidate will publish research results in peer-reviewed journals either independently or in collaboration with PI or other members of the research team. The candidate will assist in writing proposals for funding from federal and state agencies and other funding organizations.

Candidate must possess the ability to work cooperatively and collegially within a diverse environment.
