

The Department of Radiology at the University of California, Davis invites applications for two qualified Junior Specialist positions.

The position of Junior Specialist has a narrow focus in a specialized area and provides technical or specialized expertise (e.g., with instrumentation and research equipment, or with research methods) in the planning and execution of a research project. Junior Specialists are required to be actively and significantly involved in publishable research activities, including reviewing journal articles and engaging in discussions on research and the interpretation of research results. Junior Specialists are also expected to participate in appropriate professional/technical societies or groups and other educational and research organizations as well as review research proposals, journal manuscripts, and publications as applicable related to their research area of expertise.

The specific duties of the candidate(s) will include MRI scan acquisition, MRI data analysis, SPECT/CT scan preparation, report, grant and manuscript writing and reviewing. Other specific responsibilities of this position will be to participate in lab meetings and conferences to present his/her research, provide timely feedback on project progress to the PI and to adhere to all relevant regulations such as IRB and HIPAA.

The ideal candidate will have strong interpersonal, communication, and decision-making skills; as well as the ability to work well independently and as part of a team.

This position requires a Bachelor degree in Science or related field. With a minimum of 1 year experience in laboratory and/or related research. Other basic qualifications, experience with instrumentation and research equipment, software programs, social science research methods, humanities scholarship, or creative activities.

SALARY RANGE: Step I - \$17.99 per hour or Step II - \$19.99 per hour, commensurate with qualifications and experience. Appointments are made contingent upon availability of funding.

The term of appointment is short term, based on the needs of the research projects. Appointments may be made up to 100%.
