The ideal candidate for this position would be an MD with subspecialty training in pediatric pulmonary medicine, who has completed additional research training in the epidemiology and genomics of asthma, with a particular focus on obesity and asthma. The candidate should have experience with epidemiologic and genetic data analysis, and data management using SAS, R, and Unix, and be familiar with genomics, and DNA- and RNA-sequencing techniques. The ideal candidate should have active NIH K-mechanism funding. The candidate should have a record indicating strong potential for academic productivity and further extramural funding.
