

The Department of Radiology at the University of California, Davis is looking to hire two abdominal imaging radiologists either at the rank of Assistant, Associate, or Full Professor (commensurate with experience and credentials) in the Clinical Professor or Health Sciences Clinical Professor series.

Qualified candidates must possess a MD or DO degree, be fellowship trained or undergoing training in abdominal imaging, eligible for licensure in the State of California, and board certified in Diagnostic Radiology. Proficiency in all aspects of abdominal imaging including MR, CT, Ultrasound and Fluoroscopic studies is required. The position involves participation in patient care, education, and scholarly activity.

The Abdominal Imaging Division currently has 10 faculty, and 3 fellows. The Department has state of art equipment including 7 clinical MR scanners, 6 CT scanners, 2 PET-CT scanners, and 17 Ultrasound units. In addition to covering the full spectrum of abdominal imaging, such as CT, MR, Fluoroscopy, and General Ultrasound, some division members also participate in high-risk obstetric ultrasound, and performing cross-sectional abdominal interventional procedures. The division is integral in teaching of residents and medical students. We also have a research faculty embedded in our section.
