Faculty Position Available in Pancreatic Cancer Research

An opportunity is available to join the faculty of the Weill Cornell Medical College of Cornell University at the rank of Assistant Professor (research track, non-tenure eligible), within the Department of Surgery. Candidates must hold MD, PhD, or combined degrees with sufficient training to develop an independent research program. The successful candidate will lead a creative and innovative basic research program with strong translational potential in the context of our Pancreatic Cancer Initiative. The successful candidate must be very familiar with using mouse genetic models and be fully adept at molecular techniques. A strong background in developmental biology, transcriptional networks, and cancer progression is also important. They are expected to work within a team, but also develop independent research projects. Prospects include interaction with our Meyer Cancer Center, a centralized biorepository to support translational research, a new state-of-the-art Center for Digestive Care, and recent expansion of the campus. The Weill Cornell Medical College is located on Manhattan's upper east side, a collaborative partner within the prestigious Tri-Institution, including Rockefeller University, Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center, and affiliated with the New York Presbyterian Hospital and the Hospital for Special Surgery.
